his story

Reverend Johnson Wambua was raised in Makueni, Kenya and graduated from Scott Christian University in 2000 with a BA in Theology. He then began work as a full-time pastor, and has planted several churches over the past 20 years. He received his MA in Christian Counseling from Nairobi International School of Theology in 2009, and is married with four adult children.

Johnson's ministry focus is evangelizing and discipling the next generation through academics, sports, and the transforming power of the gospel. His work is centered in two locations, in Mathare Valley Slums, where children live in poverty and lack basic necessities such as food, healthcare, and education and in Masai land, where migrating families uproot their children continuously.

In 2005, at AIC Zion Church in Mathare, Johnson began a primary school with 16 children and christened it AIC Zion Education Center. Since its opening, AIC Zion has added high school classes, and the number of students has increased to 600. Students enjoy a playground, breakfast and lunch, a health facility, modern bathrooms, and sports and drama programs.

Johnson then opened Lion of Judah Wisdom School in Masai land in 2018. The primary school has 150 students, and Johnson obtained enough land to expand the existing school, add a high school, and plant crops to provide meals for the children.

Rev. Wambua covets our prayers for the continued safety, health, and educational success of the children, as their national test scores largely determine their futures.
