## THEIR STORY

Sami Vogeler began attending The Bible Chapel at the age of 10 and was actively involved in many areas in Student and College Ministries. **She was greatly impacted on her first mission trip to Panama in 2014, where she first developed a love for missions.** Her second trip to Panama in 2016 had a lifelong impact on her. After high school, Sami attended Cosmetology school and began working in the hair industry. She felt something was missing and wanted to develop her faith and learn how to share Christ through her vocation. So, in 2018, she signed up for a three-month Creatives Internship with YWAM (*Youth With A Mission*) Radiant in London, followed by a five-month DTS (*Discipleship Training School*). This began her missionary journey. Sami met Jetson in 2018 where they did their DTS together. **Jetson loves God and the arts and has been passionate about missions since joining the London team.** Sami and Jetson got married in May of 2024 and are continuing their ministries and missions together.

In 2023, they joined as full time volunteer staff with Hope and Anchor Community Church (*a church they have been a part of since coming to London*). This church also partners with their arts charity, One UK. Through these two charities they have continued their ministries in London and have grown in responsibilities and leadership. Sami joined initially as a hair stylist for the church's salon, Think+ coffee and ink, a non-profit initiative that serves as a hub for outreach to the community of Camden. She still helps to manage the salon, but has also grown in responsibilities with the base administration and helping to lead the church's young adults ministry alongside Jetson and some others. Jetson's other roles include the media ministry, graphic design ministry, worship team, and leading the evangelism outreach ministry.

- Jetson is officially on the church preaching rota and he'll be preaching almost once a month alongside our pastor and a few others. We ask for prayers for God's wisdom in this area as he steps into this new role. He preached two weeks ago for the first time in this new role, if you go to Hope and Anchor Community Church on facebook or instagram (and soon youtube), you can see some parts of his preaching.
